- 2021 Grant - just came off of this grant (gave presentations on national results in Fall 2022)
- 2023 Grant - now diving into (includes Community of Practice to work with 19 states/territories to implement projects based on recommendations from Wildlife Viewer Survey)
- June Pathways conference - very involved in and have handouts with more information
- Upcoming Academy in 2024: in Duck, NC February 19-23, 2024
- "Wildlife viewer survey enhancing relevancy and engaging support from a broader constituency" was the title of the grant

- Areas between the executive summary and conclusions have meat of information to dive deeper into
- To prepare for the survey a literature review, QR code provided, lit review went over all wildlife viewer survey information from other surveys from the past 10 years. It is condensed to highlight the salient points to take back to agencies (link for lit review available on Working Group's AFWA page as well)
- Survey itself, QR code, available online. Data is also available online for national and regional data from the 4 AFWA regions
- Information from survey can also be accessed from webinar

Multi-State Conservation Grants For 2023

- Implementing Recommendations from Wildlife viewer Survey
 - From that, building a Community of Practice (group of people who interact with each other on an ongoing basis to share knowledge, resources, experience and expertise about a common interest)
 - There are 19 member states and territories including Yukon
 - Committed to doing a project that supports one of the recommendations from the Wildlife Viewer Survey and 5 buckets of project ideas. People can work with others States that are also working with others that are working on same buckets.
 - The states are doing some project to engage the community, brainstorming together and communicating
- Those doing revenue generating project for their states through wildlife viewers will try to find a way for wildlife viewers to engage with their state agencies through some type of monetary support of the agency. Those states will be working together to create a brain trust of what's working and what's not working, troubleshooting and working through the red tape of the state agency
- Process has been great. Had first two monthly calls
- Virginia Tech has been the organization that have received the most from the MultiState Grant and the working group is partner. Va Tech is guiding the process.
 - Will hold monthly community practice meetings
 - May 31 - All day in person work session at Pathways Conference June 1 - Ft Collins, Co
 - Collaborating with Va Tech to create a project plan, share progress and by end of the year hope to have a fully implemented project
 - Community of practice will give 19 unique projects that a state agency or territory have implemented based on the recommendations from the survey.
 - The results will show how it worked out, what it looked like. So that other organizations (state, federal, nonprofits, etc) can get ideas and good examples of how people are putting research into action; will be presented in a website/story map at the end of the project

Topics with the 5 Buckets

- Develop programs to engage Viewers
- Connect with BIPOC and underserved audiences
- Develop opportunities for viewers to financial support agencies

- Provide information to wildlife viewers
- Promote around-the-home wildlife viewing.

Other Project Components -

- Online Viewing information Platform - Create a website, that will house all research, literature and reports and case studies from the 19 states and territories
- Share wildlife viewing materials
- Urban viewers analysis with researchers to do a deeper dive
- Presentations of Wildlife Viewer Survey results - ACI, wildlife society, and getting in front of wider audiences.
