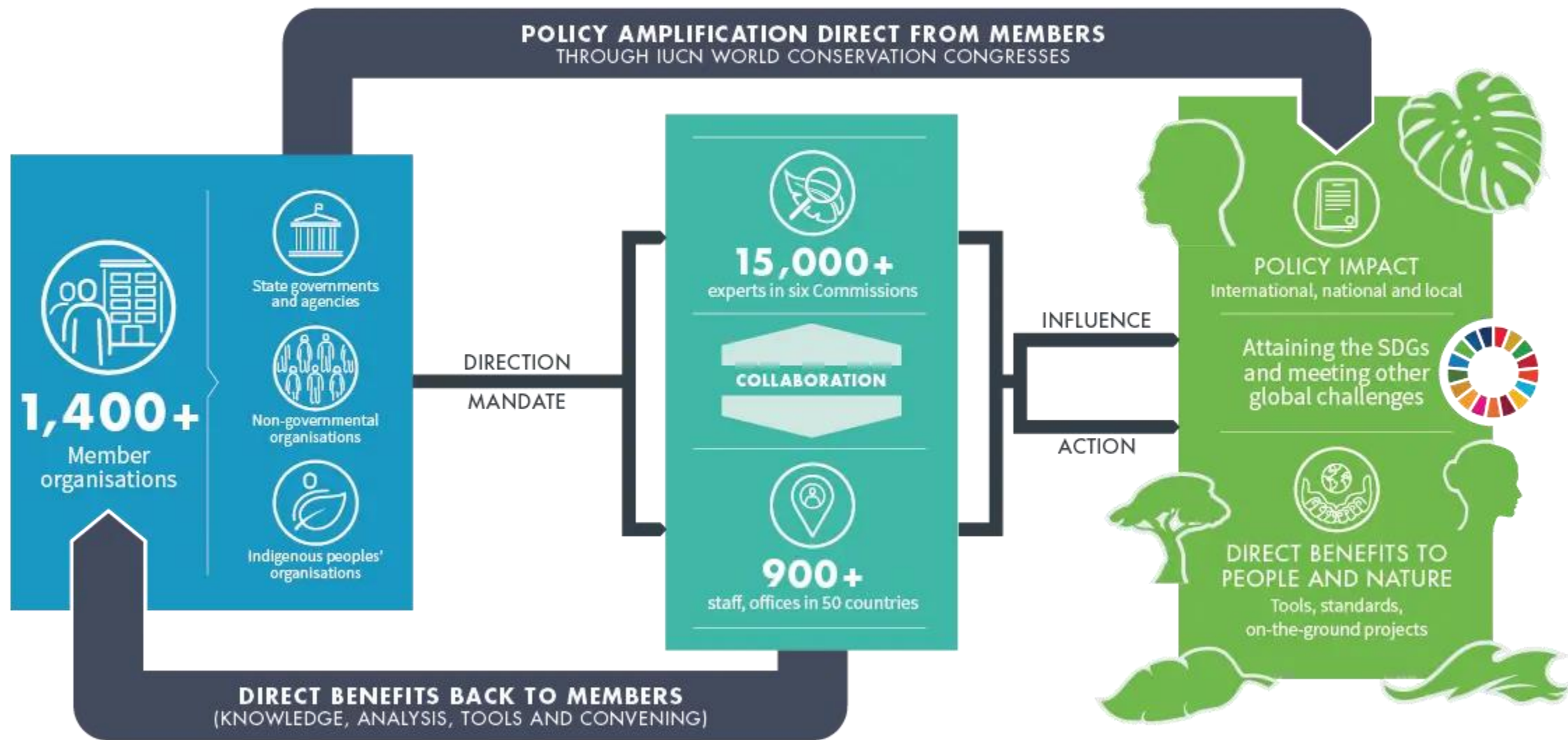

OUR THEORY OF CHANGE

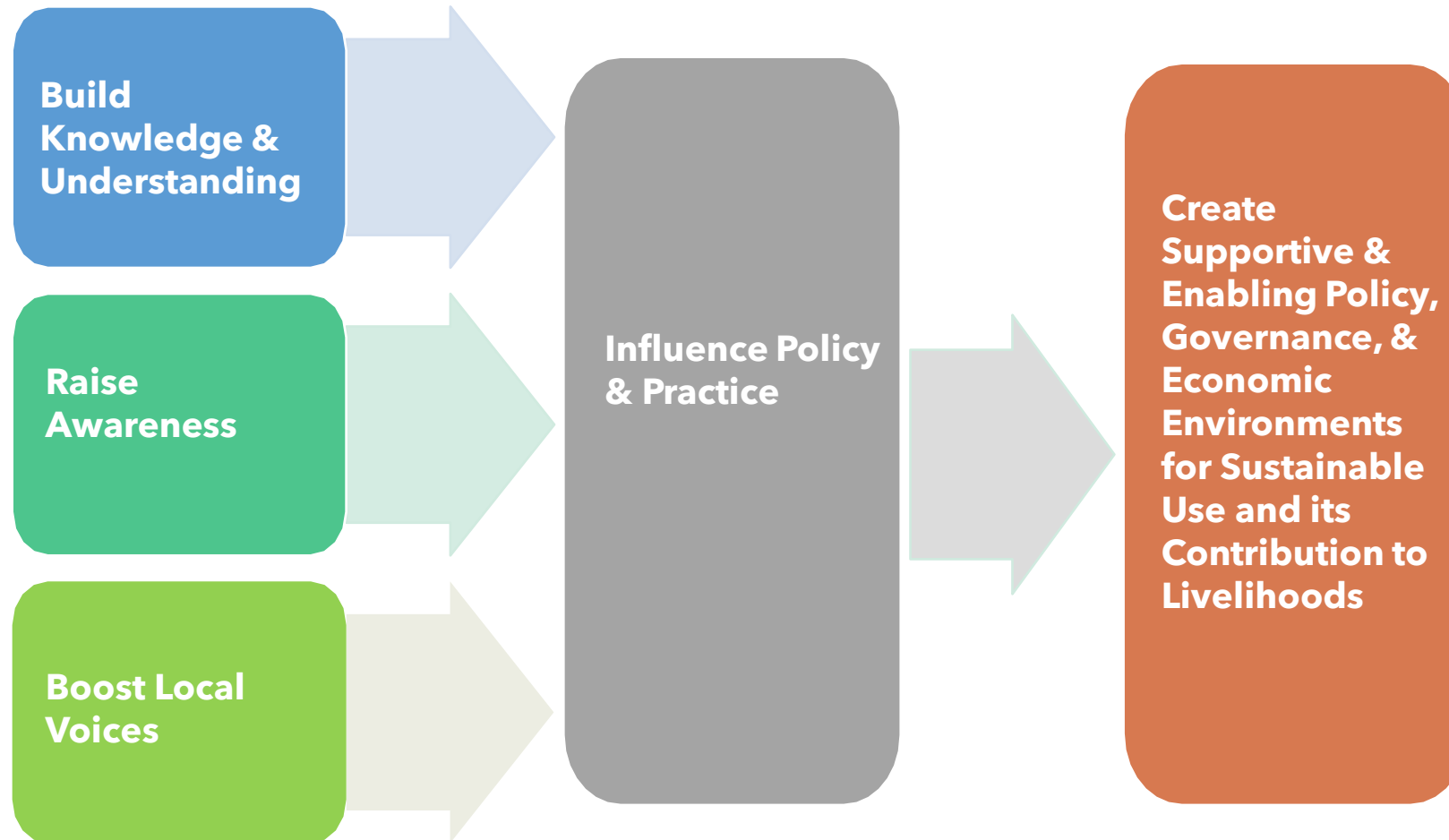


Figure 1: SULi's Intervention Logic
